3RD CHINA NATIONAL TRAFFIC SAFETY DAY

Last December all 37 primary schools of AIP Foundation's Walk Wise program in Kai County, China took part in pedestrian safety activities to celebrate China's 3rd National Traffic Safety Day. Together with Chevron, AIP Foundation organized the highly



successful Walking School Bus for schools, in which a group of students and supervisors walk along safe walking routes to school, carrying road safety message signs to share with the community. The Walking School Bus increases community awareness of pedestrian safety and helps to ensure children get to and from school safely.

CHINA LAUNCHES FIRST NATIONAL TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT WEBSITE

The Ministry of Public Security (MPS) kicked off the first nationwide traffic management website on Tuesday, according to a ministry announcement. Coinciding with the country's annual "Traffic Safety Day," the website www.122.cn will provide real time traffic data to the public, especially useful for private car users. The website will base its data on the information collected and reported by the nation's 270,000 traffic policemen and video surveillance records to better guarantee traffic safety. The public can instantly consult with traffic police online and learn about hot topics and events in traffic control, said Head of the Traffic Bureau of the MPS. The traffic department will also make policy and enforcement adjustments in line with the suggestions submitted online.

Furthermore, the website will also play a role in road safety education, giving traffic knowledge lectures and safe travel tips to the public.

She made the following statement: "The World Day of Remembrance gives us a painful but necessary reminder that working towards improving road safety is a never ending process. It is clear that we have come a long way, but more needs to be done.



That is why I would like to take this opportunity to personally pledge to make road safety one of my top priorities as the European Transport Commissioner. I hope that I can count on you to work actively together with the European Commission, to help make our roads safer in Europe. Together we can save thousands of lives."

DAKAR 2015 TESTING GROUND FOR ROAD SAFETY



As an example of how Dakar 2015 contributes to improving safety, speed limiters were built into the Mini and trucks from the Dutch team. Along the routes in the villages strict speed limits of 30 or 50 km / h are applicable to the participants of Dakar. It is

good that the speed in the villages is decreasing through a speed limiter. It is expected that the system will be applied within a few years in the Dutch and European road transport. Also good experiences were gained through a measuring system for tire pressure. 90% of the trucks driving with low tire pressure. Blowouts and overheating of the tires are one of the greatest losses in road transport. Not only by the downtime or any damage to the truck, but also because of (fatal) injuries of other drivers after a crash. Crashes also have a significant financial and economic impact by causing congestions.

50% OF YOUNG VICTIMS OD FATAL CRASHES IN NINE U.S. STATES USED ALCOHOL OR MARIJANA

Half of young drivers who died in car crashes in U.S. states such

as California, Hawaii and West Virginia were under the influence of either alcohol or marijuana, or both, according to statistics for fatal road accidents involving 16- to 25-year olds in nine U.S. states.



These nine states all routinely perform toxicological tests on the blood or urine specimens of drivers who die in car crashes.

Overall, 50.3 percent of the deceased tested positive for alcohol, marijuana or both. Of these, 36.8 percent were under the influence of alcohol, 5.9 percent used only marijuana and 7.6 percent used both substances.

WEIGHTS AND DIMENSIONS OF TRUCKS LEGISLATION IN EU

The amendments to the Weights and Dimensions of trucks legislation that has been ongoing in Brussels for the past couple of years is finally coming to a close. There is



disappointment that negotiations between the Council, Parliament and Commission concluded that safety and environmental design changes to the front of the lorry cab will not be possible before 2022.

The agreement, which still has to be formally agreed by member states on Friday December 12th and by plenary vote at Parliament, will mean that a manufacturer will be allowed to increase the length of the cab to improve safety and environmental performance. The European Transport Safety Council (ETSC) said that the EU deal to postpone new rules enabling lorry designs is a setback for road safety.
